

Answer

The bar graph delineates the count of individuals either males or females who attended different evening courses at an adult education centre in the year 2009 and the pie chart compares the proportion of participants by age groups.

Overall, the number of women attendees was more than that of men participants in all courses except sculpture. Majority of the participants were those whom aged between 50 or over.

In 2009, language skills was the most preferred evening course with 60 female attendees which was twice as that of male students. The similar distribution was seen in drama classes. Painting course had slight difference in attendance of both gender participants recorded as 30 women and 25 men students. Sculpture was the only course in which count of male attendees was more as compare to the female students which was 10 and 5 respectively.

Looking at the pie chart, the significant proportion (42%) of older students aged 50 or over attended evening courses. Around one fourth proportion of the total attendees was those whom aged between 40 to 49. The figures for 30 – 39 and 20 – 29 aged students were 16% and 11% respectively. The least interest was shown by young ones (aged under 20) witnessed as only 5%.
