

### **SAMPLE ANSWER**

The rendered pie chart illustrates the proportion of different kind of families fell under the poverty line in UK in the year 2002

Overall, it can be noticed from the graph, sole parents and single persons with no child had the highest poverty rate among all the families of UK.

According to the pie chart, sole parents of United Kingdom had the highest percentage (26%) among the family types which lived in paucity in 2002. The second position was occupied by parents who had no child whose poverty rate was just under a quarter. The couples having children family type also experienced financial problems which were accounted as 15%, while this proportion was less by about 10% for the single aged person, aged couple and couple with kids.

Moving to the remaining details, it is given in the chart that 14% of all households of the UK were living in destitute conditions. Moreover, aged people had less poverty rate and couples with children were enjoying with better economic conditions than the couples without any child.
