

The bar graph contains the unemployment rate in the five European countries according to the gender of its citizen in 2005. The data has been presented in percentage.

Overall, it is noticeable that employment rate of women is higher than men among all the listed countries, and Poland ranked the first in both the categories, while Denmark stood last.

Looking at the proportion of jobless males, the highest employment rates were observed in Poland and Italy recorded as 37% and 23% respectively. However, the lowest proportion was in Denmark which was only 5%. The females who were jobless in Germany and Hungary had approximately three times higher proportion than Denmark.

As regards to the unemployed males, Poland had the highest proportion recorded as 15%, as more men were workless there as compared to other nations. In the case of Germany, the proportion of jobless males was 5% less that of Poland. The unemployment ratio in Italy and Hungary was nearly 6-7%. However, there were only 3% people in Denmark who had no job.
