

ANSWER

The number of UK travellers in millions, who covered their distances by three modes of transportation during 60 years, has been compared in given polyline graph.

Overall, it is clearly seen that car was the most popular means of transport among UK commuters, whilst they gave less preference to train in given time period.

In 1970, the count of travellers, who used car, was recorded as 6 millions which was higher than bus and trains' passengers which were almost 4 millions and 2 millions respectively in the same year. After 30 years, the count of car users climbed to about 7 millions, however the people, who were travelling through train, rocketed to 6 millions. Moreover, a slight drop of 0.5 millions was seen in case of bus users in 2000.

Almost 9 millions people will drive car to reach at their workplaces in the last year. Subsequently, train using passengers are expected to incline to approximately 5 millions, on the other hand, bus will become least popular transport in 2030, accounted for only 3 millions.
